### From Hollywood to Bollywood

Where do top movies (*movie* is the American English equivalent for *film*) like *X-Men* and *Pirates of the Caribbean* come from? They usually come from Hollywood – the film capital of the USA. Hollywood's film studios make about 500 films a year and they make all kinds of films. It's easy to see a film in Hollywood; there are several cinemas on Hollywood Boulevard. But it's difficult to find



a famous actor in Hollywood because film stars don't live there. They often have very large houses in Beverly Hills, about 3km away.

On the other side of the world, Mumbai is India's film capital. The Indian film industry, or 'Bollywood', makes about 1,000 films a year and about 14 million people go to the cinema to watch these films every day in India. The nickname Bollywood comes from the city of Bombay (which is now called Mumbai) and Hollywood. Bollywood films are usually musicals with a lot of dancing and romance.


