AM I RUBY OR RACHEL?



Ruby Taylor and Rachel Storr are very **unusual**. They are **identical twins**, but they've got different parents. The twins are from China, but they are adopted. 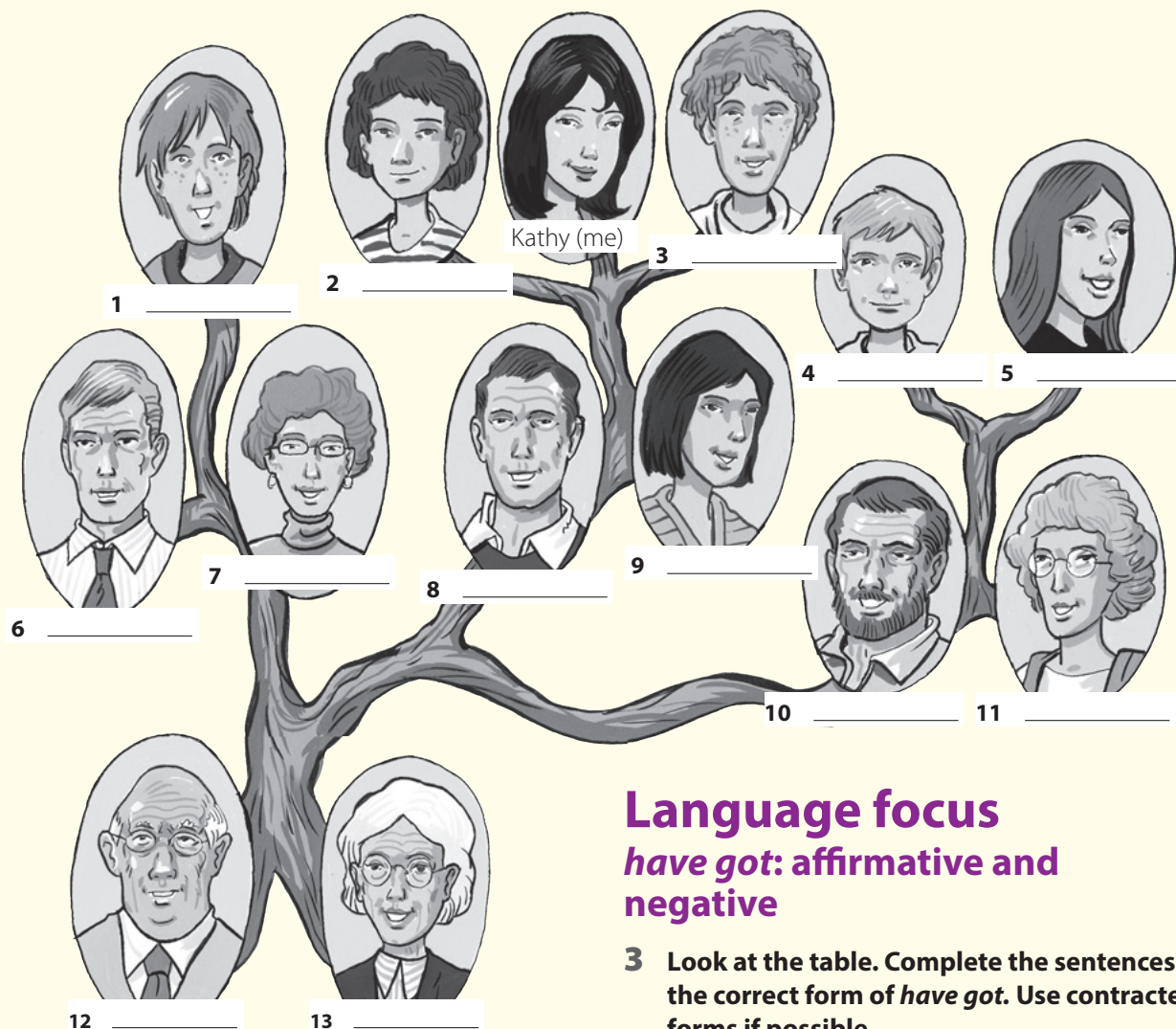

- we use **have / 've** with *I, you, they, we*
- we use **has / 's** with *he, she, it*
- we always use **got** after **have** in affirmative and negative sentences and in questions
- we don't use **got** after **have** in short answers

Comparative and superlative adjectives

Remember that:

- we double the consonant at the end of adjectives with one syllable
~~biger~~ → bigger → the biggest
- we take away the y and add **-ier/-iest** to the end of adjectives that end in y
~~noisyer~~ → noisier → the noisiest
- we use **more / the most** + adjective with two or more syllables. We don't use **more / the most** + adjective + **-er**
~~more beautifuler / the most beautifuler~~ → more beautiful / the most beautiful

Spell it right! Adjectives

Remember that:

- we never add **s** to adjectives when we describe more than one thing
~~two newss mobile phones~~ → two new mobile phones
- adjectives with **-ful** have only one **l**.
~~It's a wonderfull time!~~ → It's a wonderful time!
