#### AM I RUBY OR RACHEL?







Ruby Taylor and Rachel Storr are very **unusual**. They are identical twins, but they've got different parents. The twins are from China, but they are adopted. - we use **have / 've** with I, you, they, we
- we use **has / 's** with he, she, it
- we always use got after have in affirmative and negative sentences and in questions
- we don't use *got* after *have* in short answers

### Comparative and superlative adjectives

#### Remember that:

- we double the consonant at the end of adjectives with one syllable
  - <del>biger</del> → bigger → the biggest
- we take away the *y* and add **-ier/-iest** to the end of adjectives that end in *y* 
  - noisyer → noisier → the noisiest
- we use more / the most + adjective with two or more syllables. We don't use more / the most + adjective + -er more beautifuler / the most beautifuler → more beautiful / the most beautiful
