## My City

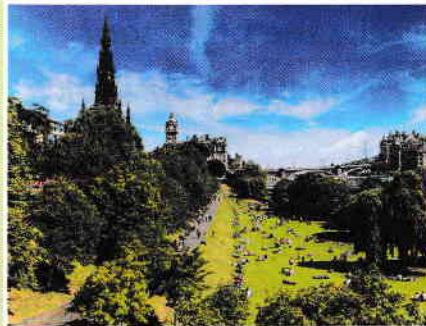
I love my city. It's Edinburgh, in Scotland. Scotland is in the United Kingdom. There are fantastic places to visit. Come and see!
