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## SCURTĂ BIOGRAFIE

**Christian Louis Heinrich Köhler** (1820–1886) a fost compozitor, dirijor și profesor de pian german.

A studiat pianul la Viena cu Carl Maria von Bocklet (pian), Simon Sechter (teorie) și Ignaz von Seyfried. Ca dirijor, a lucrat în Marienburg și Elbing. Stabilizat în Königsberg în 1847, s-a concentrat pe predarea pianului și compoziție. Printre elevii săi s-au numărat Adolf Jensen și Hermann Goetz.

Printre lucrările sale cele mai importante se numără 3 opere, un balet, mai multe cărți de muzicologie și lucrări cu studii pentru pian. Lucrările sale au fost apreciate de Liszt și Wagner.
