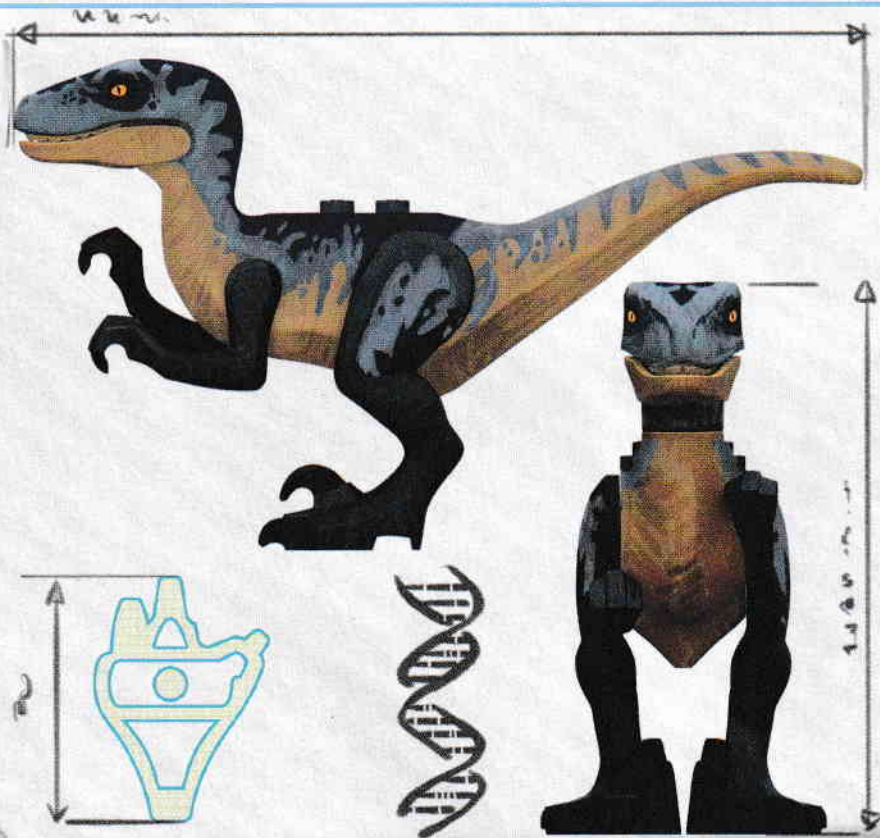

This carnivorous, pack-hunting dinosaur is known for its speed, agility and intelligence. It is advised to take extra care during any encounter.

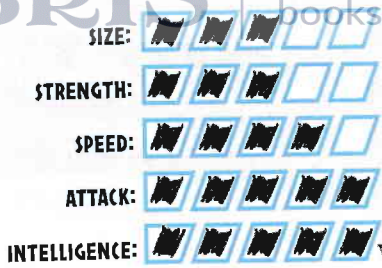


I might be a gutsy girl, but I still feel shivers down my spine when I remember my first meeting with a raptor!

Some people, like Owen Grady (THE Owen Grady!), try to bond and cooperate with them!

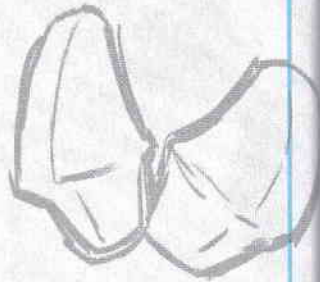


VELOCIRAPTOR

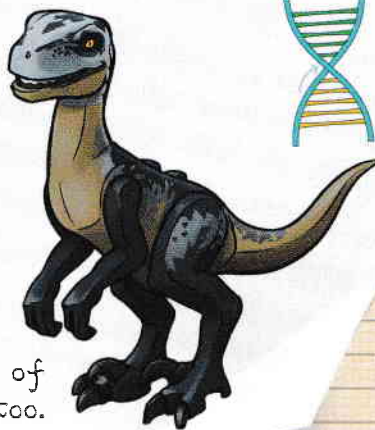
OBSERVATIONS:

Raptors have strong hind legs that allow them to run incredibly fast. The legs help with effective hunting and fighting, thanks to a special claw on each hind foot.

Those extra-large, curved claws can be used for both hunting and protection. That's not the only claw to look out for, though. The others are sharp as knives, too!



Every individual *Velociraptor* has its own distinctive features, such as subtle differences in colour, size and personality.



Velociraptors sometimes remind me of lions. Their habitat looks similar, too.

Velociraptors live in packs, which helps them hunt for bigger prey and stay safe. They live, hunt and protect each other in family groups, just like some of our modern-day predators.



These dinosaurs care very much for their young. They will protect their eggs no matter what – even if it means they have to fight with a very angry *T. rex*! Baby raptors are usually looked after by older individuals (not just their parents).

Velociraptors can also bond with humans – but don't be fooled! They won't just simply listen to people and be controlled. The relationship has to be based on mutual respect.

Gaining a raptor's trust takes a LOT of time, as you might expect!

DO NOT FORGET!

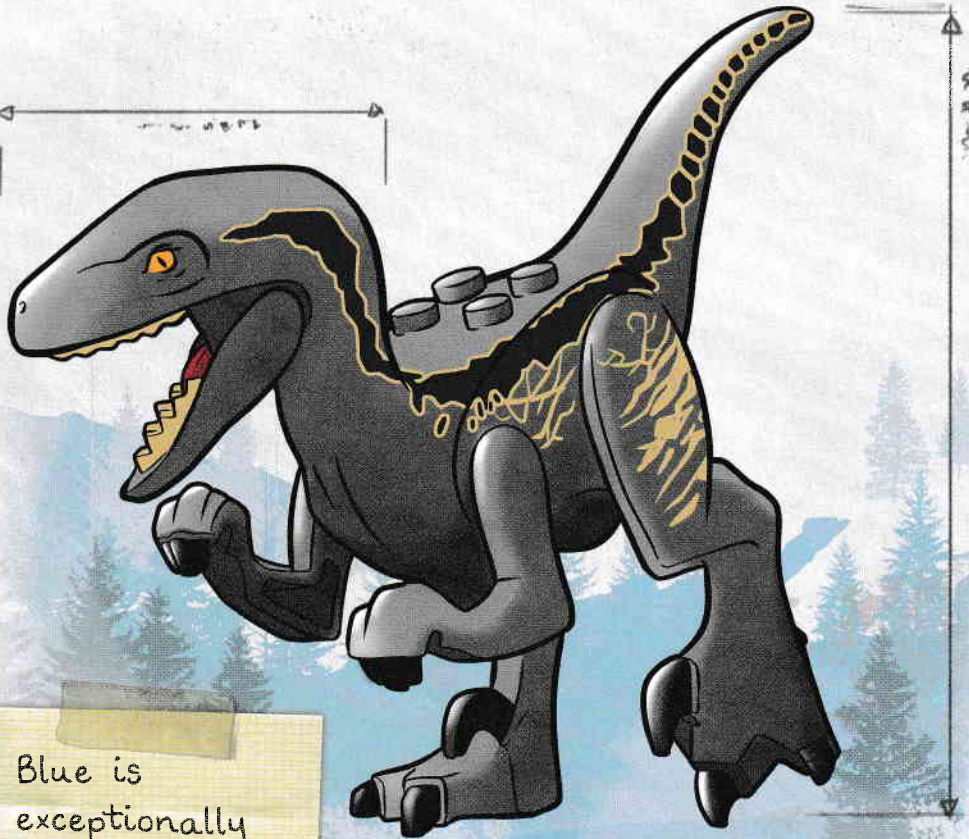
These dinosaurs are incredibly smart. They can cooperate with each other and not only create ambushes, but also organize whole traps for their prey.

I've noticed that their communication patterns play a big role in how they hunt. They use a number of different calls, from small grunts to loud growls.

When trained, they will react to signals made with a clicker. Don't play with a ballpoint pen near them – who knows what they might read into from your clicking!

BLUE

Blue is one of the most extraordinary *Velociraptors* cloned in modern times. She shows affection and empathy and is able to make conscious decisions. She is a true pack leader.



Blue is exceptionally intelligent! She is also very loyal.



Blue is almost as tall as her trainer, Owen. However, her body is much heavier. She weighs almost as much as a horse!

But I wouldn't ever try to ride her!

Since she is a *Velociraptor*, Blue prefers to stay in overgrown areas with access to water. She lives with her pack, but her intelligence lets her deal with anything on her own when needed.

Blue is very sociable, and when she's not with her pack she is with Owen. She can communicate with Owen by responding to his clicker. So impressive!
